Our regional 100% campaign has assisted our reps and activists to recruit members and strengthen our union in workplaces from Port of Felixstowe in the east of the region, Stansted to Luton Airports in the west, from the buses through to health and construction.

As your regional delegates we pushed for £35 a day strike pay from day one, the best strike pay of any union in the UK, and we will fight to increase this if re-elected.

We have also worked with the region to double that rate in many significant disputes regionally.

We were active in the 2015 General Election to ensure the victory of Labour MPs in the region, with increased parliamentary representation in London and Eastern constituencies.

Your region was at the forefront in defeating Zac Goldsmith in the London Mayoral elections, **now we must ensure Sadiq delivers on his election promises.**
